


International Human Trafficking

Definition:

The recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of persons, by means of the threat or use of force or other forms of coercion, of abduction, of fraud, of deception, of the abuse of power or of a position of vulnerability or of the giving or receiving of payments or benefits to achieve the consent of a person having control over another person, for the purpose of exploitation



Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA)

Landmark legislation that serves as the guiding principle which the United States and over 60 international governments mirror in their anti-trafficking efforts. The U.S. Department of State signed this in 2000.

The **TVPA** takes a three-prong approach to combatting trafficking in persons:

- 1. Prosecution
- 2. Protection
- 3. Prevention
