Why is SSBG important to Pennsylvania?

Child Abuse and Neglect

In 2017, there were 4,625 child victims of abuse or neglect in Pennsylvania. In 2017, 16,891 children in Pennsylvania lived apart from their families in out-of-home care, compared with 16,086 children in 2016.

SSBG 2016 funding would provide 220,007 children with protection services.

Protective Service for Adults

Domestic, dating, and sexual violence are costly and pervasive problems in the U.S., causing victims, as well as witnesses and bystanders, in every community to suffer incalculable pain and loss. 15.5 million Children in the United States live in families in which partner violence occurred at least once in the past year, and seven million children live in families in which severe partner violence occurred.

Over 98,000 adults will receive services through SSBG funded adult protective services in FY 2018.

Residential Treatment

791 children received residential services funded through SSBG. The services rehabilitate delinquent youth through diagnostic assessments, counseling, psychological and psychiatric services, and developing treatment plans.

Other Services

207,365 recipients received services including community mental health services and community intellectual disability services.
