### Why is SSBG important to Washington?

### **Foster Care Services for Children**

In 2017, 11,355 children in Washington were in foster care, compared with 10,959 children in 2016. Of the children living apart from their families in 2017, there were 3,569 children whose parent's rights were terminated and were waiting on adoption. 1,345 children were legally adopted through a public child welfare agency.

11,500 children received services through SSBG funding.

### **Other Services**

Other Services includes CWS SW, intake and assessment SW, crisis counseling SW, home support specialist, FRS SW, family home licensors, unified home study staff, group home licensors, licensing supervisors, and CPSI supervisors.

SSBG funded services for 11,494 children in Washington.

#### **Case Management**

Case management services are services or activities for the arrangement, coordination, and monitoring of services to meet the needs of individuals and families.

Over 6,000 children received services in Washington.

#### **Protective Services for Children**

In 2017, Washington had 95,603 total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 37.7%, or 36,023 reports were referred for investigation.

85,969 children were the recipients of services funded by SSBG.
