Dear Chairman Davis and Ranking Member Walorski: Dear Chairman Grassley and Ranking Member Wyden:

The Child Welfare League of America endorses the Family First Transition Act.

The legislation will help state child welfare agencies access the new intervention funding made available by the Family First Prevention Services Act of 2018. This comes at an important time when the nation has experienced a near ten percent increase in foster care placements, much of it due to the impact that the recent opioid epidemic has had on the ability of families to support their children and keep them safe.

We believe the added \$500 million in funding will provide important resources to states building in-home services and better coordination of needed substance use and mental health services. We appreciate the legislation's temporary delays in some of the spending thresholds on meeting specific evidence-based standards while states build up their research, development, inventory and implementation of well-supported, supported, and promising services.

CWLA looks forward to our continued work with both committees in the coming months. We must continue to build a continuum of child welfare services from primary prevention, intervention, strong permanency outcomes and greater support for youth that exit care without a family.
