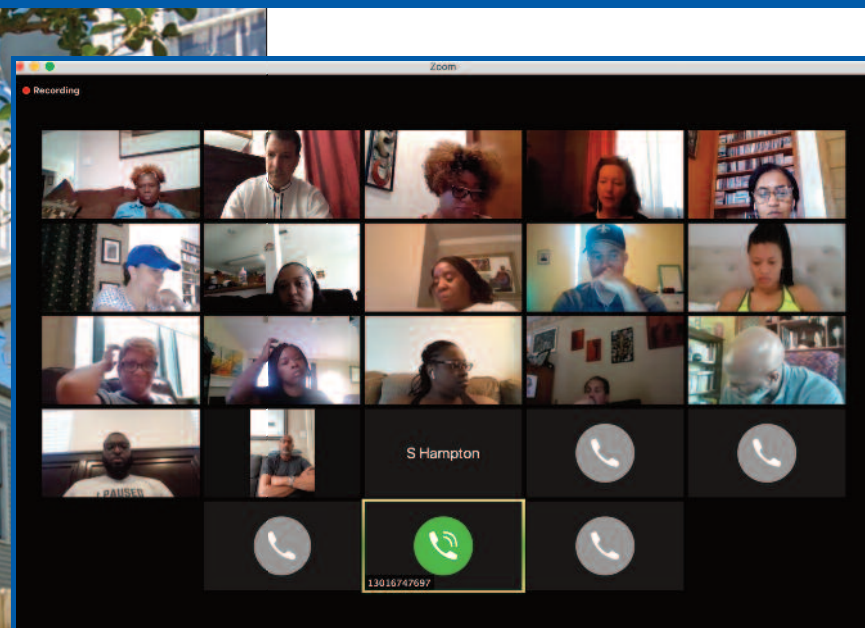


TRIBUTE: Child Welfare Response to Coronavirus

Proyecto Nacer in Puerto Rico distributed nearly 700 fresh food boxes to children and families in need and provides services and supports to over 100 teen parent families.





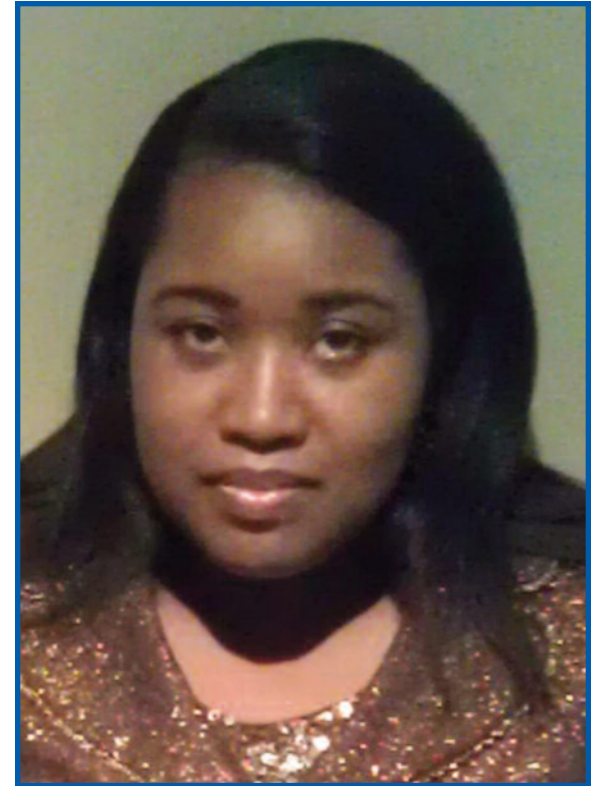
Staff members of the New York City Administration for Children's Services who have gone "above and beyond" during COVID-19 public health crisis, include:



Fernando Lorence who ensured his staff had the resources they needed to telework efficiently from home, including personally delivering laptops to his team.



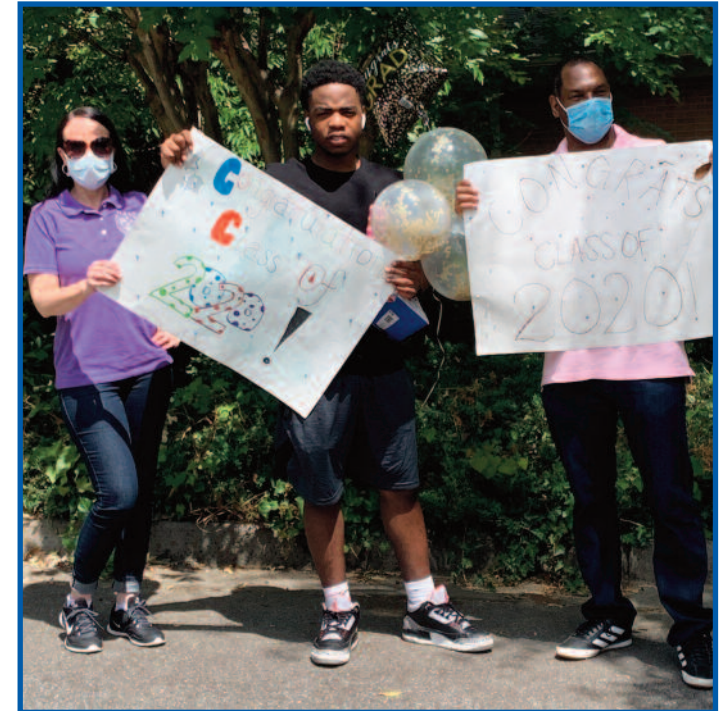
Jodiann Swearing who went the extra mile to support her children and families with distance learning, including connecting with school staff and IT to ensure electronic access and personally helping with math lessons.

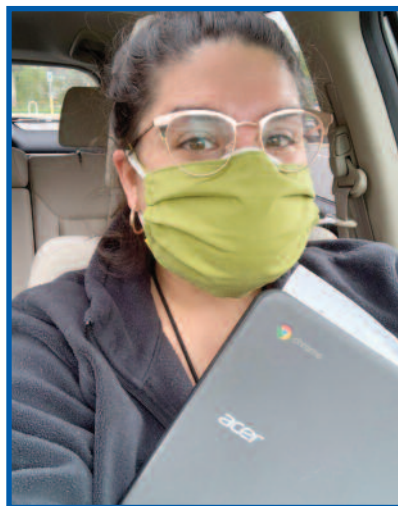

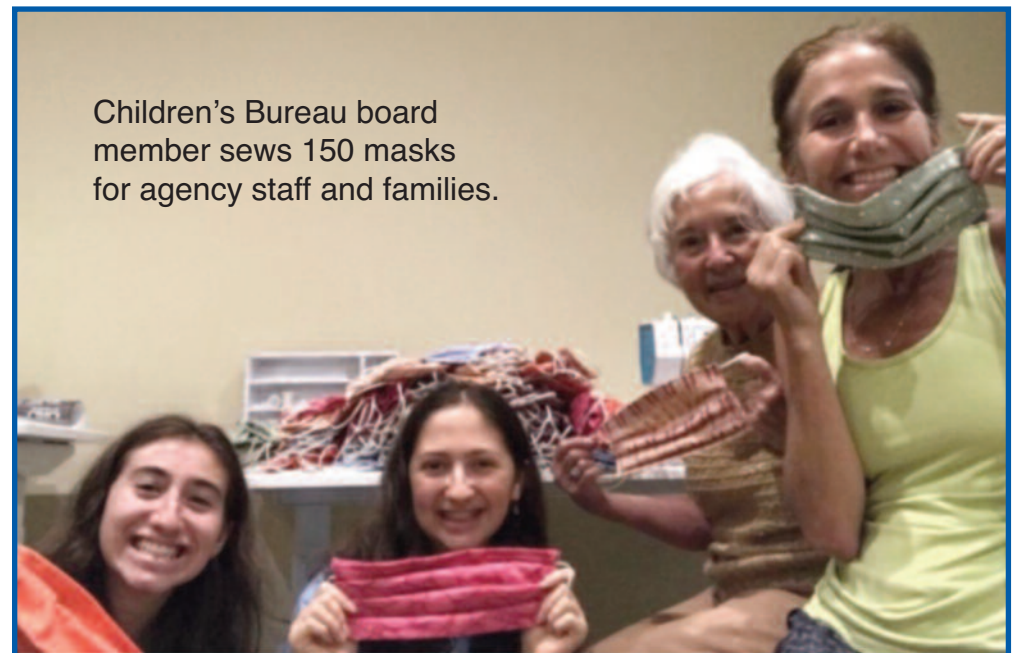
