It facilitates cooperation, coordination, partnerships to connect public service systems





# The State of Housing

Housing challenges facing families and youth:

- Affordability
- Availability
- Eligibility
- Navigation
- Access

Inadequate housing contributes to the risk of entering foster care for 1 out of every 6 children involved in CPS investigations



#### Families Thrive in Safe and Stable Homes

**Population:** Families with children in the United States experiencing housing instability and risk of or involvement with child welfare, especially those identifying as BIPoC.

**Result:** Define and develop continuum of housing interventions and connected set of services for families experiencing housing instability and risk/involvement with child welfare, and integrate across systems from prevention through family reunification with an equity focused, multi-sector approach.





#### Keeping Families Together

Two generation approach to supportive housing for families facing child welfare involvement, housing instability and complex need/histories








# Keeping Families Together (KFT)

- LSS awarded funding from CSH to develop and implement KFT in Benton and Sherburne counties
- LSS partnered with Benton and Sherburne Child Welfare teams
- Community partners involved in project development
  - Avivo, Catholic Charities, Central MN Mental Health Center, Central MN CoC, United Way, St. Cloud school district, Rise, St. Cloud and Stearns Co. Housing Authority, MN HMIS



# Keeping Families Together (KFT)

- Collaboration between housing services and child protection services
- Goal was to assist families involved in child protection when a housing need is identified:
  - To prevent the removal of children from the home

OR

To assist in the reunification of children

# What is a housing need?

At risk of homelessness

Literal homelessness

## Housing Services - Prevention

- Currently housed but at risk of losing housing
  - i.e., notice to evict; non-renewal of lease; late rent payment notice
- Doubled up
  - living w/someone else and not on the lease
  - asked to leave
- Self-pay at a hotel/motel

# Housing Services – Rapid ReHousing/homeless means:

- Living in a car
- Living in a shelter
- Living in a place not meant for habitation,
- exiting an institution (jail/treatment/hospital) where (s)he has resided for 90 days or less & was homeless before institution;
- hotel/motel paid by agency
- fleeing Domestic Violence

## LSS KFT Referral process

- Referral must have current child protection case in Benton or Sherburne county
- Child Protection identified that housing is a need to prevent removal or aid in reunification
- Referral form was developed by Core Leadership team members to target high-need families with a points system for various barriers
  - History of persistent or repeated contacts with child welfare
  - Social supports
  - History of Homelessness or housing instability
  - Rental barriers

## LSS KFT Housing Services

- Complete assessment for placement on the housing priority list through Coordinated Entry
- Assist with community housing search
- Financial assistance with security deposit or rent (amount determined on case-by-case basis)
- Case management available from up to 2 years

# Case Management

- LSS Case Manager and Child Protection staff have joint meeting with referral
- LSS Case Manager completes an initial assessment of housing needs and history
- LSS Case Manager and household search for housing, address barriers (evictions, unpaid balances, no income)


# Parent Advisory


- KFT wanted parent representatives with have current or previous lived experience with homelessness/housing instability and/or the child welfare system.
- The goal is that membership includes families from populations disproportionately impacted by these systems.
- \$40 Stipends per meeting paid to parents following monthly meeting via teams
- Parent Advisory reviewed and provided feedback on our referral form and phases of case management services

#### KFT Outcomes – as of 4.1.2023

- 32 referrals received, enrolled 20 households during CSH grant period
- Of the 20 families working with KFT:
  - 8 referrals were literally homeless and obtained housing
  - 5 referrals were able to resolve a housing crisis and maintain housing
- In Sherburne County
  - 20% of CP cases were closed more quickly due to KFT program
  - 53% of CP workers reported they felt the intervention of KFT prevented further abuse and neglect


### KFT data – as of 4.1.2023

# Sustainability

- Benton and Sherburne Counties have committed to sustaining the services
  - Will be using county funds for direct assistance
  - Opening referrals to all of Child Welfare (Child Protection, Parent Support Outreach, Truancy, etc.)
- LSS will hire another Part Time staff person for KFT (total of 1.5 FTE)

#### Keeping Families Together: Spokane

#### Initiative Highlights:

- Expanded services and support for families moving into Gonzaga Family Haven.
- Increased housing access and coordination for families exciting Rising Strong.
- Improved collaboration with Spokane Housing Authority and Department of Children Youth & Families, particularly around utilization of FUP vouchers.
- Enhanced local dialogue on need for preventative services targeting potential or current welfare system involved families.
- Community focus on need for improved data and story telling related to reducing foster care placements, time in care, and long-term stabilization.

On site we offer behavioral health services, case management, head start & early head start, community programming, garden space, scholarships to Gonzaga Prep & & more.

- Criminal justice support and advocacy






# Additional Family Housing

- Scattered site family supportive housing 26 units
- Mother Teresa Haven 72 supportive housing units under construction (Est. completion 3/23)

# Strategies to Advance KFT

- Build and strengthen multi-sector partnerships
  - Collaboration and agreements between agencies, sectors and initiatives to streamline pathways for families to access needed housing and services, secure resource commitments and adopt supportive standard agency operating procedures.
- Optimize Funding and Resources
  - Identify and align/connect existing housing stability strategies and resources across agencies
  - Leverage and prioritize federal and state and local funding for children, youth, and families
  - Prioritize housing strategies as part of new or planned prevention/family strengthening and child welfare efforts



# Strategies to Advance KFT

- Share and utilize data across sectors/agencies to:
  - Understand and address racial disparities and disproportionality
  - Design and direct programs to match needs and ensure equitable and timely access to resources
  - Develop and monitor key performance indicators and measure results.
- Create capacity within child welfare agency
  - Coordinate internal/external housing resources and provide staff support
  - Maintain partnerships to coordinate housing and services across agencies
  - System to identify/screen for family housing stability needs and connect to housing resources
