## Alabama's Children

## Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Alabama had $\mathbf{2 7}, \mathbf{1 8 5}$ total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 26,837 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 11,618 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 10.5 children per 1,000 ( $4.4 \%$ decrease since 2018).
- Of the 11,618 children, $\mathbf{9 , 4 2 3}$ were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims $=<1$ years, representing 2,009 of the 11,618 cases.

## Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, Alabama reported 544 infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Alabama reported 231 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Alabama does not have a Family First plan approved by the administration.

Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- $\underline{71 \%}=$ parents of the child.
- $29 \%$ = non-parents or unknown relationship.
Child victims (2022):
- $55 \%=$ female; $45 \%=$ male.
- Child fatalities increased from $\underline{36}$ in 2021 to $\underline{38}$ in 2022.
- Alabama reported 5 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 6,818 victims and 4,541 non-victims.

## Foster Care and Adoptions

- $8, \underline{538}$ total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 5,260 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 3,350 children entered care and 3,278 exited.
- 772 children were adopted; $\mathbf{1 , 5 9 8}$ were waiting to be adopted.
- $1.5 \%$ decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by $2.8 \%$ from 2021.

## Juvenile Justice

- 103 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 0 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 70 for Property Crimes.
- 9 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 678 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 798 kids in 2019; 15\% decline).


## Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? $\underline{2021}$



- In $2021, \underline{340}$ children exited foster care due to age ( $2.9 \%$ decrease from 2020).
- 3,423 children were living with nonrelatives; 797 stayed with a relative.
- 738 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 53 children classified as runaways.
- $4 \%$ of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

## Alabama's Children

## Child Poverty

- 323,000 children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 ( $29 \%$ of all children).
- $\underline{24 \%}$ of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients fell from $\underline{14,108}$ in 2021 to $\underline{12,738}$ in 2022 ( $9.71 \%$ decrease).


## Child Poverty Over Time



- The state spent $\$ \mathbf{2 5}, \mathbf{4 8 3}, \underline{622}$ on WIC in 2022 , serving 108,661 people: a $2 \%$ decrease in total participants and $1 \%$ increase in spending since 2021.
- 746,550 people were food insecure in 2021, including 204,830 children.
- $47.6 \%$ of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.


## Teens \& Youth

- 18,000 youth ( $16-19 \mathrm{yrs}$ ) were not in school nor working in 2022 (7\%)
- In 2020 , there were zero reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and 96 reports among ages 15-24.
- 84 children $<19 y r s$ were killed by a firearm in Alabama in 2020.

Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Alabama spent $\$ \mathbf{2 8 1}, \underline{\mathbf{3 8 0}}, \underline{\mathbf{5 3 9}}$ on child welfare services in 2020.
- Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- $\$ 143,928,938=$ from the federal government
- $\$ 137,451,601=$ from state and local funds.
- $\underline{6}, \mathbf{0 5 3}$ low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 ( $10.4 \%$ of births).
- 7, $\mathbf{6 0 9}$ preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 ( $13 \%$ of births).
- $11.67 \%$ of all White babies
- $16.9 \%$ of all Black babies
- $\underline{\mathbf{3}, \underline{641}}$ births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -a rate of 23 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- 444 infants $<1 \mathrm{yr}$ died in 2021; a rate of 7.6 per 1,000.


## Medicaid Expansion

Alabama is not a Medicaid expansion state.

The significant funding sectors of the $\$ 143, \underline{928}, \underline{938}$ in federal funding received in Alabama in 2020:

- $\$ 39,518,839$ as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- $\$ 25,676,452$ as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Alabama's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was $\$ \mathbf{3 3}, \mathbf{1 1 7}, \mathbf{1 7 1}$
