
### Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Arizona had <u>84,730</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, <u>44,806</u> were screened in for response by CPS.
- 12,324 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 7.8 children per 1,000 (20.5% decrease since 2018).
- Of the 12,324 children, 7,060 were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = **<1years**, representing 2,995 of the 12,324 cases.

#### Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2022




#### Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, Arizona reported <u>0</u> infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Arizona reported 0 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Arizona has a Family First plan approved by the administration.



#### Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2022




#### Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2020):

- 88% = parents of the child.
- 12% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

#### Child victims (2022):

- <u>51%</u> = female; **49**% = male.
- Child fatalities decreased from <u>18</u> in 2020 to <u>14</u> in 2022.
- Arizona reported 0 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **4,620** victims and **51,631** non-victims.


# Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, 2022



### Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>20,565</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 12,358 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **6,874** children entered care and **8,207** exited.
- 2,371 children were adopted; 3,015 were waiting to be adopted.
- 17% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also increased by 19.9% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021





### Juvenile Justice


- <u>18,502</u> total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 1,299 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 2,839 for Property Crimes.
- 2,970 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- <u>351</u> children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from **606** kids in 2019; 42% decline).

#### Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? <u>2021</u>



- In 2021, <u>428</u> children exited foster care due to age (15.6% decrease from 2020).
- 3,409 children were living with non-relatives; 7,160 stayed with a relative.
- 2,288 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 193 children classified as runaways.
- <u>5%</u> of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.






### Child Poverty

- <u>396,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (25% of all children).
- <u>29%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients fell from <u>14,550</u> in 2021 to <u>11,906</u> in 2022 (18.17% decrease).
- The state spent \$37,211,084 on WIC in 2022, serving 130,073 people: a 0.19% decrease in total participants and 1.9% increase in spending since 2021.
- <u>751,690</u> people were food insecure in 2021, including 226,080 children.
- 41.3% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.

#### Teens & Youth


- <u>31,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (8%)
- In 2020, there were <u>18</u> reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and 187 reports among ages 15-24.
- <u>99</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Arizona in 2020.

### Health

# • 142,000 children had no health insurance in 2022 (2.7% decrease from 2021).

- <u>625,000</u> children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 (5.7% decrease from 2021).
- <u>134,128</u> children in Arizona were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (52.67% increase from 2020).


## Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>







# Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, 2021



- 6,132 low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 (7.9% of births).</li>
  7,705 preferm births (<37wks) in 2021</li>
- <u>7,795</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (10% of births).
  - 9.34% of all White babies
  - 14.27% of all Black babies
- <u>3,551</u> births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -- a rate of **15** in every 1,000 teen girls.
- 429 infants <1yr died in 2021; a rate of 5.5 per 1,000.</li>


### Medicaid Expansion

# Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Arizona spent <u>\$945,178,337.74</u> on child welfare services in 2020.
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$560,529,997 = from the federal government
- \$377,472,825 = from state and local funds.

#### Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the \$560,529,997 in federal funding received in Arizona in 2020:

- \$132,731,565 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$168,279,649 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Arizona's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was \$51,906,246
