
California's Children

Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, California had <u>382,145</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, **192,197** were screened in for response by CPS.
- 50,869 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 6 children per 1,000 (20.3% decrease since 2018).
- Of the 50,869 children, **40,083** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 8,425 of the 50,869 cases.



Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2022


Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, California reported <u>2,970</u> infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- California reported 1,313 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

California <u>has a Family First plan</u> approved by the administration.








Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- $\underline{86\%}$ = parents of the child.
- 14% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2022):

- 53% = female; 47% = male.
- Child fatalities increased from <u>135</u> in 2021 to <u>164</u> in 2022.
- California reported 74 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 34,789 victims and 295,721 non-victims.

Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, <u>2022</u>






Foster Care and Adoptions


- <u>67,699</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **45,924** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **20,609** children entered care and **21,775** exited.
- **5,864** children were adopted; **15,349** were waiting to be adopted.
- 4.1% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021–2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 6.1% from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021





- In 2021, <u>3,110</u> children exited foster care due to age (2.9% increase from 2020).
- 22,707 children were living with non-relatives; 17,028 stayed with a relative.
- 2,590 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 707 children classified as runaways.
- <u>5%</u> of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.



California's Children Child Poverty

- <u>2,417,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (28% of all children).
- <u>41%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from <u>606,783</u> in 2021 to <u>712,607</u> in 2022 (17.4% increase).

Child Poverty Over Time




- <u>287,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2022 (10.6% increase from 2021).
- <u>3,899,000</u> children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 (2.8% decrease from 2021).
- <u>1,601,751</u> children in California were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (11.6% decrease from 2020).

- The state spent <u>\$329,202,996</u> on WIC in 2022, serving 936,127 people: a 1.2% decrease in total participants and 0.91% increase in spending since 2021.
- <u>4,104,060</u> people were food insecure in 2021, including 1,182,720 children.
- <u>49.2% of households receiving SNAP</u> benefits in 2019 had children.


Teens & Youth

- <u>130,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (6%)
- In 2020, there were <u>49</u> reports of suicide among children aged 10–14 and 473 reports among ages 15–24.
- <u>290</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in California in 2020.

Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>








California's Children

Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2021</u>



<u>30,605</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 (7.3% of births).

- <u>38,443</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (9.14% of births).
 - 7.66% of all White babies
 - 12.67% of all Black babies
- <u>12,480</u> births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -- a rate of **10** in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>1,704</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2021; a rate of **4.1** per 1,000.


Medicaid Expansion

California has been a <u>Medicaid expansion</u> state since 01/01/2014.

Funding for Child Welfare Services

- California spent <u>\$3,089,425,474.02</u> on child welfare services in 2020.
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- **\$3,075,750,760.02** = from the federal government
- State and local funds were not reported.

Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the \$<u>3,075,750,760.02</u> in federal funding received in California in 2020:

- \$799,928,812 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$599,101,241 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- California's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was <u>\$548,004,471</u>
