## Delaware's Children

## Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Delaware had $\mathbf{2 1}, \mathbf{3 1 4}$ total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 5,697 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 1,077 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 5.2 children per 1,000 ( $13.9 \%$ decrease since 2018).
- Of the 5,032 children, 895 were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims $=<1$ year, representing 119 of the 1,077 cases.

Plans for Safe Care ${ }^{22 \%}$

- In 2022, Delaware reported 333 infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Delaware reported 322 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Delaware does not have a Family First plan approved by the administration.

Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2022


Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- $67 \%=$ parents of the child.
- $33 \%=$ non-parents or unknown relationship.
Child victims (2022):
- $55 \%=$ female; $45 \%=$ male.
- Child fatalities decreased from $\underline{7}$ in 2021 to $\underline{6}$ in 2022.
- Delaware reported zero total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 440 victims and 12,514 non-victims.

## Foster Care and Adoptions

- $\underline{804}$ total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 548 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 370 children entered care and 256 exited.
- 55 children were adopted; 148 were waiting to be adopted.
- $23.4 \%$ increase in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by $37.5 \%$ from 2021.

## Juvenile Justice

- 2,924 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 214 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 551 for Property Crimes.
- 256 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 135 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (increase from 129 kids in 2019; 4.7\% increase).


## Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? $\underline{2021}$



- In 2021, $\underline{52}$ children exited foster care due to age ( $34.2 \%$ decrease from 2020).
- 263 children were living with nonrelatives; 67 stayed with a relative.
- 84 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 8 children classified as runaways.
- $4 \%$ of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

## Child Poverty

- $\underline{50,000}$ children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 ( $24 \%$ of all children).
- $22 \%$ of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from $\mathbf{7}, \underline{\mathbf{3 8 3}}$ in 2021 to $\mathbf{7}, \underline{845}$ in 2022 ( $6.3 \%$ increase).

## Health

- 7,000 children had no health insurance in 2022 ( $12.5 \%$ decrease from 2021).
- 85,000 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022.
- $12, \underline{838}$ children in Delaware were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (5.42\% decrease from 2020).
- The state spent $\$ \mathbf{5}, \mathbf{0 5 0}, \mathbf{8 0 4}$ on WIC in 2022 , serving 46,765 people: a $3.3 \%$ increase in total participants and $5.6 \%$ decrease in spending since 2021.
- $99, \underline{530}$ people were food insecure in 2021, including 30,040 children.
- $\mathbf{4 3 . 7 \%}$ of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.


## Teens \& Youth

- $\mathbf{2 , 0 0 0}$ youth ( $16-19 \mathrm{yrs}$ ) were not in school nor working in 2022 (3\%)
- In 2020, there were zero reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and zero reports among ages 15-24.
- 13 children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Delaware in 2020.

## Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Delaware spent $\mathbf{\$ 7 4 , 4 5 2 , 7 6 9}$ on child welfare services in 2020.
- Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- $\$ 9,489,194$ = from the federal government
- $\$ 63,693,345=$ from state and local funds.
- 952 low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 ( $9.1 \%$ of births).
- 1,151 preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 ( $11 \%$ of births).
- $10.2 \%$ of all White babies
- $13.5 \%$ of all Black babies
- 425 births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -- a rate of 14 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- $\underline{53}$ infants $<1 \mathrm{yr}$ died in 2021; a rate of 5.1 per 1,000 .


## Medicaid Expansion

Delaware has been a Medicaid expansion state since 01/01/2014.

The significant funding sectors of the $\$ 2,489,194$ in federal funding received in Delaware in 2020:

- $\$ 2,318,573$ as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- $\$ 3,273,173$ as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Delaware's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was $\$ \mathbf{3}, \underline{\mathbf{2} 30}, \underline{967}$
