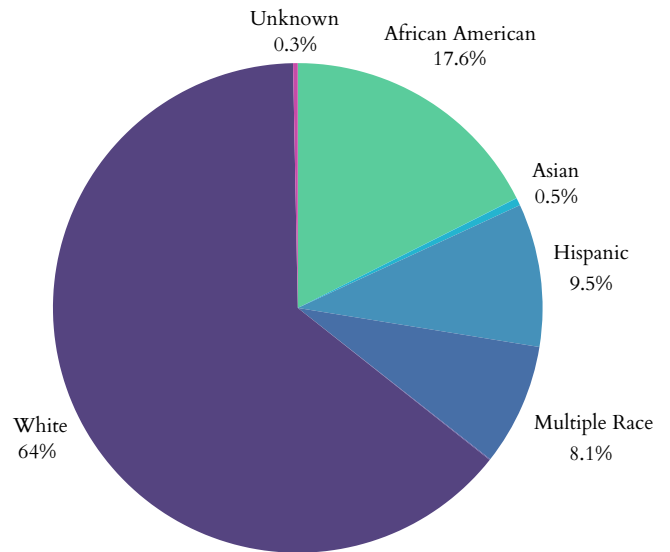


Indiana's Children

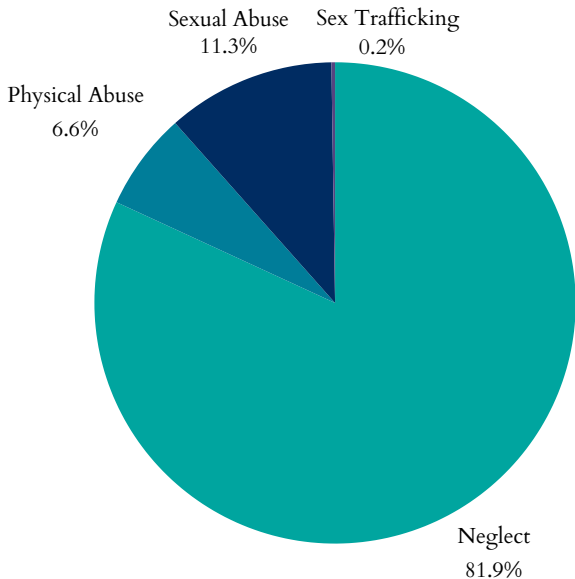
Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Indiana had **171,085** total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 102,320 were screened in for response by CPS.
- **19,185** child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 12.2 children per 1,000 (25.4% decrease since 2018).
- Of the 19,185 children, **13,632** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = **<1 years**, representing 4,595 of the 19,185 cases.

Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2022



Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- **77%** = parents of the child.
- **23%** = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2022):

- **52%** = female; **48%** = male.

- Child fatalities increased from **57** in 2021 to **62** in 2022.
- Indiana reported **49** total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **11,100** victims and **9,640** non-victims.

Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, Indiana reported **575** infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Indiana reported **309** plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Indiana has a Family First plan approved by the administration.

Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, 2022

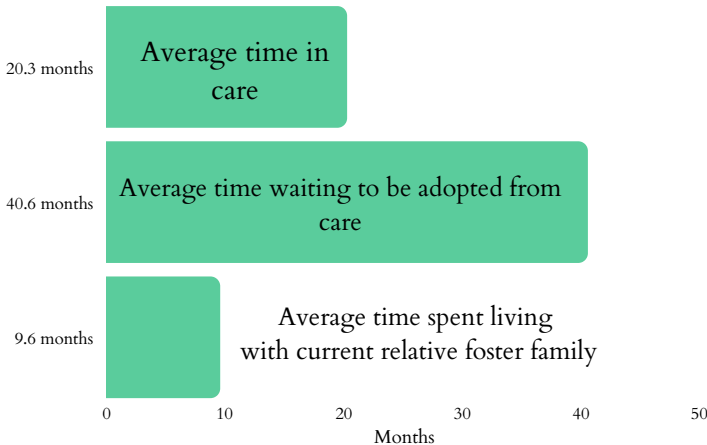


Indiana's Children

Foster Care and Adoptions

- **19,201** total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **11,457** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **6,212** children entered care and **7,744** exited.
- **1,872** children were adopted; **2,748** were waiting to be adopted.
- **13.5%** decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also increased by **1.5%** from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021



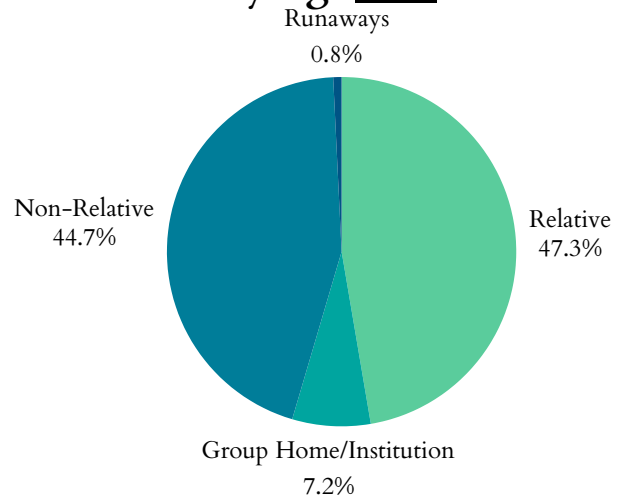

Juvenile Justice

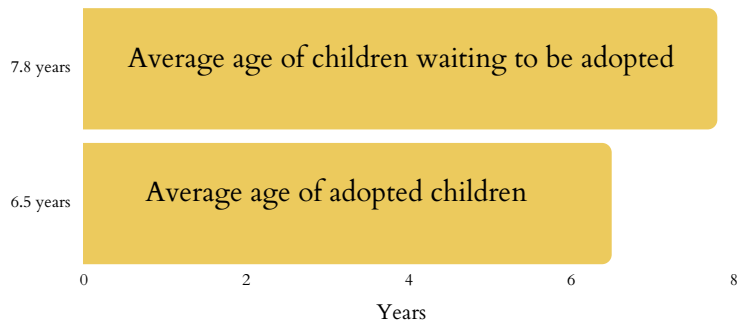
- **5,211** total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- **292** for Disorderly Conduct.
- **902** for Property Crimes.
- **780** for Drug Abuse Violations.
- **837** children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from **1,155** kids in 2019; **27.5%** decline).

Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



- In 2021, **327** children exited foster care due to age (**4.5%** increase from 2020).
- **4,540** children were living with non-relatives; **4,810** stayed with a relative.
- **736** children were staying in group homes or institutions; **78** children classified as runaways.
- **5%** of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

27.5% The decline since 2019 of children living in juvenile correction facilities.



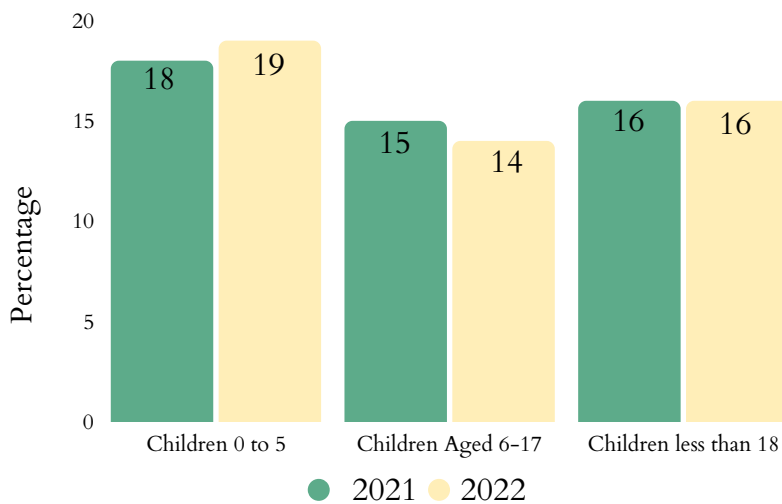
Indiana's Children

Child Poverty

- **392,000** children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (25% of all children).
- **22%** of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients fell from **17,862** in 2021 to **9,373** in 2022 (47.5% decrease).

- The state spent **\$39,425,875** on WIC in 2022, serving **151,510** people: a 1.2% decrease in total participants and 8.3% increase in spending since 2021.
- **730,480** people were food insecure in 2021, including **204,290** children.
- **46.3%** of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.

Child Poverty Over Time



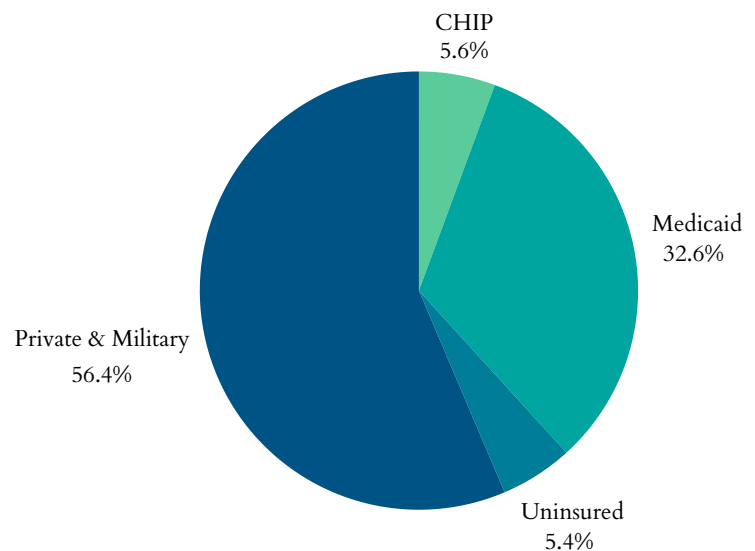
Teens & Youth

- **21,000** youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (5%).
- In 2020, there were **zero** reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and **96** reports among ages 15-24.
- **84** children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Indiana in 2020.

Health

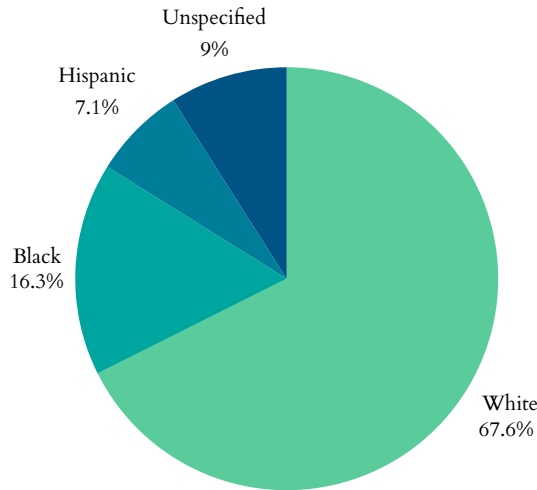
- **91,000** children had no health insurance in 2022 (9% decrease from 2021).
- **609,000** children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 (1.3% decrease from 2021).
- **105,116** children in Indiana were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (14.6% decrease from 2020).

Funding for Child Welfare Services

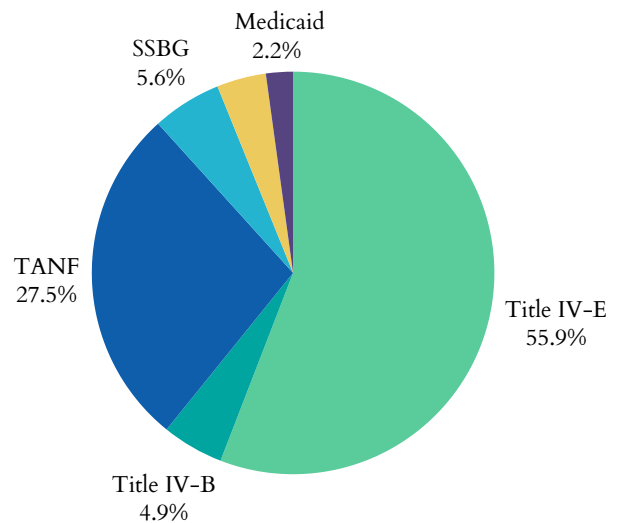
- Indiana spent **\$1,008,470,899.72** on child welfare services in 2020.
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- **\$238,393,162.16** = from the federal government
- **\$761,027,936.25** = from state and local funds.

- **6,704** low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 (8.4% of births).
- **8,679** preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (10.9% of births).
 - 10.3% of all White babies
 - 14.1% of all Black babies
- **3,843** births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -- a rate of 17 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- **537** infants aged <1yr died in 2021; a rate of 6.7 per 1,000.

Medicaid Expansion

Indiana has been a Medicaid expansion state since 02/01/2015.

Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the **\$238,393,162.16** in federal funding received in Indiana in 2020:

- \$45,357,416.12 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$79,132,615.70 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Indiana's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was **\$33,242,090**
