## Michigan's Children

## Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Michigan had $\mathbf{1 7 4 , 2 6 9}$ total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, $\mathbf{6 8 , 3 5 9}$ were screened in for response by CPS.
- 23,500 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 11.1 children per 1,000 ( $37.7 \%$ decrease since 2018).
- Of the 23,500 children, 14,840 were firsttime victims.
- Largest age group of victims $=<1$ years, representing 2,703 of the 23,500 cases.

Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, Michigan reported $\mathbf{6 , 6 5 5}$ infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Michigan reported $\mathbf{6 , 4 4 5}$ plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Michigan has a Family First plan approved by the administration.

Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- $\underline{74.6 \%}=$ parents of the child.
- $25.4 \%=$ non-parents or unknown relationship.
Child victims (2022):
- $50.9 \%$ = female; $49.1 \%=$ male.
- Child fatalities increased from $\underline{35}$ in 2021 to $\underline{61}$ in 2022.
- Michigan reported 17 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to $\mathbf{9 , 6 5 9}$ victims and 17,941 non-victims.

## Foster Care and Adoptions

- 13,182 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 8,940 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 3,625 children entered care and 4,242 exited.
- 1,654 children were adopted; 3,167 were waiting to be adopted.
- $6.2 \%$ decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by $2 \%$ from 2021.

## Juvenile Justice

- $\mathbf{1 1 , 1 7 2}$ total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 408 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 2,646 for Property Crimes.
- 403 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 723 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 1,353 kids in 2019; 46.6\% decline).

- In 2021, $\mathbf{6 4 3}$ children exited foster care due to age ( $15.7 \%$ increase from 2020).
- 3,548 children were living with nonrelatives; $\mathbf{4 , 3 3 3}$ stayed with a relative.
- 500 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 79 children classified as runaways.
- $4 \%$ of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

## Child Poverty

- $5 \mathbf{5 7 2 , 0 0 0}$ children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 ( $27 \%$ of all children).
- $25 \%$ of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients fell from $\underline{23}, \mathbf{1 1 2}$ in 2021 to $\underline{22,034}$ in 2022 ( $4.66 \%$ decrease).

## Health

- 60,000 children had no health insurance in 2022 ( $13 \%$ decrease from 2021).
- 889,000 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 (.78\% decrease from 2021).
- $\underline{96}, \underline{739}$ children in Michigan were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (39.94\% increase from 2020).
- The state spent $\mathbf{\$ 6 1 , 1 7 8 , 2 3 8}$ on WIC in 2022, serving 200,223 people: a 3.42\% decrease in total participants and $4.47 \%$ increase in spending since 2021.
- $\mathbf{1}, \underline{177}, \mathbf{8 2 0}$ people were food insecure in 2021, including 282,320 children.
- $33.8 \%$ of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.


## Teens \& Youth

- 33,000 youth ( $16-19 y r s$ ) were not in school nor working in 2022 (7\%).
- In 2020 , there were 14 reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and 190 reports among ages 15-24.
- 117 children < 19 yrs were killed by a firearm in Michigan in 2020.

## Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Michigan spent $\$ \mathbf{1}, \mathbf{0 3 0}, \underline{\mathbf{5 0 7}, 271.00}$ on child welfare services in 2020.
- Child welfare services $=$ direct and administrative services
- $\$ 743,039,988.50=$ from the federal government
- $\$ 282,267,516.00=$ from state and local funds.
- $\mathbf{9 , 6 6 8}$ low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 ( $9.2 \%$ of births).
- 11,120 preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 ( $10.6 \%$ of births).
- $9.59 \%$ of all White babies
- $14.88 \%$ of all Black babies
- $\mathbf{3}, 871$ births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -- a rate of 12 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- 656 infants aged <1yr died in 2021; a rate of 6.2 per 1,000.


## Medicaid Expansion

Michigan has been a Medicaid expansion state since 04/01/2014.

- Michigan's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was $\mathbf{\$ 1 2 5 , 9 8 5 , 1 1 8}$
