
Child Maltreatment

In 2022, Pennsylvania had <u>39,775</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 39,775 were screened in for response by CPS.

- 5,005 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 1.9 children per 1,000 (6.6% increase since 2018).
- Of the 5,005 children, **4,724** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims **15 years**, representing 441 of the 5,005 cases.

Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2022




Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, <u>Pennsylvania had no reports</u> of infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Pennsylvania had no reports of plans for safe care of screened-in infants.

Pennsylvania <u>has a Family First plan</u> approved by the administration that was implemented in October 2021.



Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2022




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- <u>55%</u> = parents of the child.
- 45% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2022):

- 64% = female; 36% = male.
- Child fatalities increased from <u>65</u> in 2021 to <u>80</u> in 2022.
- Pennsylvania reported 44 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 1,119 victims and 2,086 non-victims.


Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, <u>2022</u>



Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>20,082</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 12,465 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **6,961** children entered care and **7,617** exited.
- 2,184 children were adopted; 2,975 were waiting to be adopted.
- 8.7% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021–2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 1.4% from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021





Juvenile Justice

- <u>8,153</u> total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 1,866 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 1,161 for Property Crimes.
- 685 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- <u>1,002</u> children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from **1,566** kids in 2019; 36% decline).

Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



- In 2021, <u>793</u> children exited foster care due to age (13.9% decrease from 2020).
- 5,597 children were living with non-relatives; 6,010 stayed with a relative.
- 1,476 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 137 children classified as runaways.
- 3% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.






Child Poverty

- <u>657,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (25% of all children).
- <u>25%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from <u>64,727</u> in 2021 to <u>70,470</u> in 2022 (8.87% increase).
- The state spent \$58,932,777 on WIC in 2022, serving 158,228 people: a 5.8% decrease in total participants and 3% increase in spending since 2021.
- <u>1,219,130</u> people were food insecure in 2021, including 325,170 children.
- <u>33.9%</u> of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.

Teens & Youth


- <u>41,000</u> youth (16–19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (6%).
- In 2020, there were <u>17</u> reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and **180** reports among ages 15-24.
- <u>169</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Alaska in 2020.

Health

• <u>145,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2022 (15.08% increase from 2021).

- 1,297,856 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2021 (4.9% increase from 2020).
- 295,698 children in Pennsylvania were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (17.3% decrease from 2020).

Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>



Funding for Child Welfare Services


- Pennsylvania spent \$1,887,950,707 on child welfare services in 2020.
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- **\$456,474,947** = from the federal government
- \$1,400,226,601 = from state and local funds.

- <u>11,007</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 (8.3% of births).
- <u>13,006</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (9.8% of births).
 - 8.81% of all White babies
 - 14.21% of all Black babies
- <u>4,643</u> births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -- a rate of **12** in every 1,000 teen girls.
- 719 infants aged <1yr died in 2021; a rate of
 5.4 per 1,000.

Medicaid Expansion

Pennsylvania has been a <u>Medicaid</u> expansion state since 01/01/2015.

Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the \$456,472,947 in federal funding received in Pennsylvania in 2020:

- \$163,011,230 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$130,350,081 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Pennsylvania sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was \$86,924,769
