## Virginia's Children

## Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Virginia had $\underline{83}, \mathbf{6 7 0}$ total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 33,801 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 4,563 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 2.4 children per 1,000 ( $25.6 \%$ decrease since 2018).
- Of the 4,563 children, 4,285 were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims $=<1$ years, representing 565 of the 4,563 cases.

## Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, Virginia reported 18 infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Virginia reported 13 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Virginia has a Family First plan approved by the administration.

Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- $\underline{72 \%}=$ parents of the child.
- $28 \%=$ non-parents or unknown relationship.
Child victims (2022):
- $52 \%=$ female; $48 \%=$ male.
- Child fatalities decreased from $\underline{51}$ in 2021 to $\underline{39}$ in 2022.
- Virginia reported 2 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 1,270 victims and 2,222 non-victims.

## Foster Care and Adoptions

- 7,279 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 5,039 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 2,372 children entered care and 2,240 exited.
- 792 children were adopted; 1,810 were waiting to be adopted.
- $1.2 \%$ increase in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system decreased by $9.8 \%$ from 2021.

## Juvenile Justice

- $\underline{15}, 992$ total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 497 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 2,783 for Property Crimes.
- 1,852 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 558 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 918 kids in 2019; 39\% decline).


## Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021 <br> Relative 11.6\% <br>  <br> Group Home/Institution <br> 13.1\% <br> Non-Relative 75.3\%

- In 2021, $\mathbf{4 1 3}$ children exited foster care due to age ( $24 \%$ decrease from 2020).
- 3,094 children were living with nonrelatives; 476 stayed with a relative.
- 537 children were staying in group homes or institutions; zero children classified as runaways.
- $3 \%$ of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

## Virginia's Children <br> Child Poverty

- 392,000 children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 ( $21 \%$ of all children).
- $28 \%$ of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from $\underline{33,269}$ in 2021 to $\underline{37,698}$ in 2022 ( $13.3 \%$ increase).

## Health

- $\underline{87,000}$ children had no health insurance in 2022 ( $1.1 \%$ decrease from 2021).
- $6 \mathbf{0 5}, \mathbf{0 0 0}$ children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 ( $3.2 \%$ increase from 2021).
- 221,231 children in Virginia were in the state Children Health Insurance
Program (CHIP) in 2021 ( $7.6 \%$ decrease from 2020).
- The state spent $\$ \mathbf{3 2}, \mathbf{4 7 6}, \mathbf{2 1 6}$ on WIC in 2022, serving 121,132 people: a $0.25 \%$ increase in total participants and 4.4\% increase in spending since 2021.
- 704,270 people were food insecure in 2021, including 164,680 children.
- $44.9 \%$ of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.


## Teens \& Youth

- 30,000 youth ( $16-19 \mathrm{yrs}$ ) were not in school nor working in 2022 (7\%).
- In 2020 , there were $\underline{20}$ reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and 187 reports among ages 15-24.
- 126 children < 19 yrs were killed by a firearm in Virginia in 2020.

## Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Virginia spent $\$ \mathbf{7 5 7}, \underline{251}, \underline{\mathbf{7 6 8} .24}$ on child welfare services in 2020.
- Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- $\$ 285,153,384.27=$ from the federal government
- $\$ 470,746,276.97=$ from state and local funds.
- 7,979 low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 ( $8.3 \%$ of births).
- $\mathbf{9 , 4 8 0}$ preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 ( $\mathbf{9 . 9 \%}$ of births).
- $8.8 \%$ of all White babies
- $13.6 \%$ of all Black babies
- $\underline{3}, 198$ births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2021 -a rate of 12 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- 566 infants aged <1yr died in 2021 -- a rate of 5.9 in every 1,000 infants.


## Medicaid Expansion

Virginia has been a Medicaid expansion state since 01/01/2019.

- $\$ 72,987,184.74$ as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- $\$ 70,687,785.77$ as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Virginia's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was $\$ \mathbf{5 7}, \underline{\mathbf{2 7}}, \underline{\mathbf{2 1 7}}$
