
Child Maltreatment

- In 2022, Wyoming had <u>7,286</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, <u>2,317</u> were screened in for response by CPS.
- 821 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 6.3 children per 1,000 (21.4% decrease since 2018).
- Of the 821 children, **629** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 110 of the 821 cases.

Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2022




Plans for Safe Care

- In 2022, Wyoming reported <u>10</u> infants screened with prenatal substance exposure.
- Wyoming reported **zero** plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Wyoming <u>has a Family First plan</u> approved by the administration.



Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2022




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2022):

- <u>87%</u> = parents of the child.
- 13% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2022):

- 50% = female; 50% = male.
- Child fatalities increased from <u>2</u> in 2021 to <u>3</u> in 2022.
- Wyoming reported zero total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 701 victims and 2,794 non-victims.


Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, 2022



Foster Care and Adoptions

- 1,525 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **756** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 716 children entered care and 769 exited.
- 109 children were adopted; 107 were waiting to be adopted.
- **9.6**% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system increased by 3.8% from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021




The increase since 2020 in children transitioning from foster care to independence.

Juvenile Justice

- 3,117 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 129 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 323 for Property Crimes.
- 489 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 171 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (increase from 147 kids in 2019; 16.3% increase).

Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? <u>2021</u>




• In 2021, <u>18</u> children exited foster care due to age (28.6% increase from 2020).

- 316 children were living with nonrelatives; 329 stayed with a relative.
- 123 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 2 children classified as runaways.
- 4% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

The increase since 16.3% 2019 of children living in juvenile correction facilities.






Child Poverty

- <u>27,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (21% of all children).
- <u>22%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients fell from <u>1,121</u> in 2021 to <u>1,049</u> in 2022 (6.4% decrease).
- The state spent \$3,988,705 on WIC in 2022, serving 6,723 people: a 2.5% decrease in total participants and 2.4% decrease in spending since 2021.
- <u>61,200</u> people were food insecure in 2021, including **16,100** children.
- <u>48.7%</u> of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.

Teens & Youth


- <u>2,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (5%).
- In 2020, there were <u>zero</u> reports of suicide among children aged 10-14 and
 22 reports among ages 15-24.
- **Zero** children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Wyoming in 2020.

Health

• <u>11,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2022 (31.3% decrease from 2021).

- <u>33,000</u> children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 (2.9% decrease from 2021).
- 4,996 children in Wyoming were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (269.5% increase from 2020).

Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>



Funding for Child Welfare Services


- Wyoming spent <u>\$11,574,872</u> on child welfare services in 2020.
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$11,226,898 = from the federal government

- <u>586</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2021 (**9.4**% of births).
- <u>676</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (**10.8**% of births).
 - 11.1% of all White babies
 - 10% of all Hispanic babies
- <u>295</u> births to mothers aged 15–19 in 2021 a rate of **16** in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>32</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2021 -- a rate of
 5.1 in every 1,000 infants.

Medicaid Expansion

Wyoming is not a <u>Medicaid expansion</u> state.

Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the \$11,226,898 in federal funding received in Wyoming in 2020:

- \$3,421,422 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$1,099,118 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Wyoming's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was \$2,815,058
