
Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, California had <u>396,790</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 193,617 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 47,824 were child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 5.7 children per 1,000 (25.4% decrease since 2019).
- Of the 47,824 children, **37,820** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 7,168 of the 47,824 cases.

Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




Workforce

There are <u>48,190</u> child, family, and school social workers in California with a median wage of \$33.34 (compared to California's minimum wage: <u>\$16.00</u>)

Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- 86% = parents of the child.
- 14% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2023):

- 49% = female; 51% = male.
- Child fatalities decreased from <u>176</u> in 2022 to <u>150</u> in 2023.
- California reported 48 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 32,057 victims and 61,188 non-victims.


Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, <u>2023</u>



Foster Care and Adoptions

- 67,699 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **45,924** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 20,609 children entered care and **21.775** exited.
- 5,864 children were adopted; 15,349 were waiting to be adopted.
- 4.1% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 6.1% from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021





Juvenile Justice

- 38,617 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 832 for Disorderly Conduct.
- **6,539** for Property Crimes.
- 2,459 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 2,385 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 4,131 kids in 2019; 42.3% decline).

Group Home/Institution

- In 2021, <u>3,110</u> children exited foster care due to age (2.9% increase from 2020).
- 22,707 children were living with nonrelatives; 17,028 stayed with a relative.
- 2,590 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 707 children classified as runaways.
- 5% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

Adoption, 2020




The decline since **42.3%** 2019 of children living in juvenile correction facilities.





Funding for Child Welfare Services

- California spent \$3,089,425,474.02 on child welfare services in 2020
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$3,075,750,760.02 = from the federal government
- State and local funds were not reported





- \$799,928,812 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$599,101,241 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- California's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$546,075,281

Child Care & Early Learning



- <u>25%</u> of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 13% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 12% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- <u>\$19,547</u> annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$16,432 annual cost of home-based infant care






Child Poverty

- 2,378,000 children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2023 (28% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from <u>750,247</u> in 2022 to <u>1,304,075</u> in 2023 (74% increase).


Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, 2023



HOUSING


- <u>55,187</u> children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (3.27%)
- 33.9% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- 41% of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>53,981</u> total California residents living in public housing

Child Poverty Over Time




- The state spent \$340,934,334 on WIC in 2023, serving 964,415 people: a 3.0% increase in total participants and 3.6% increase in spending since 2022.
- 4,915,450 people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 1,437,250 children.
- 49.2% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2021 had children.

Total Urban vs. Rural Population of California, <u>2020</u>








Health

- <u>30,056</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (7.5% of births).
- <u>38,020</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2022 (9.08% of births).
 - 7.87% of all White babies
 - 12.30% of all Black babies
- 11,578 births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 -- a rate of 9 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>1,632</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023; a rate of **4.1** per 1,000.

Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2022</u>




Medicaid Expansion

California is a <u>Medicaid</u> expansion state.

Maternal Mortality

- <u>228</u> California women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- For every 100,000 live births in California, there is 11 maternal deaths
- <u>285,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2023 (0.7% decrease from 2022).
- 3,875,000 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2023 (0.6% decrease from 2022).
- <u>1,601,751</u> children in California were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (12% decrease from 2020).

Health Insurance Coverage for Children, 2021






Zero to Three

- 65.9% of babies live above low-income
- 18.1% of babies live at low income
- 16.0% of babies live in poverty
- 8.5% of babies live in deep poverty
- 73.6% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, California reported <u>2,454</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- California reported 974 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

California <u>does have a Family First</u> <u>plan</u> approved by the administration.


Teens & Youth

- <u>138,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2023 (10%)
- 290 children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in California in 2020.

Mental Health

- <u>206,551</u> children received mental health treatment in California in 2022 (11.1%)
- In 2022 there were <u>6.5</u> deaths from suicide per 100,000 adolescents aged 15–19 in California.

Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>279,455</u> children in California (2.1% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>2,671</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD.
