
## Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, Delaware had <u>22,927</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 5,319 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 882 were child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 4.2 children per 1,000 (29.3% decrease since 2019).
- Of the 882 children, **738** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 92 of the 882 cases.

### Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




## Workforce

There are <u>880</u> child, family, and school social workers in Delaware with a median wage of \$23.18 (compared to Delaware's minimum wage: <u>\$13.25</u>)



### Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




#### Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- 69% = parents of the child.
- 31% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

#### Child victims (2023):

- 49% = female; 51% = male.
- Child fatalities decreased from <u>6</u> in 2022 to 7 in 2023.
- Delaware reported 0 total child victim of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **349** victims and **1,508** non-victims.


# Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, <u>2023</u>



# Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>804</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 548 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **370** children entered care and **256** exited.
- 55 children were adopted; 148 were waiting to be adopted.
- 23.4% increase in the number of children in care between 2021–2022. Adoptions from the system decreased by 37.5% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021





### Juvenile Justice


- <u>2,924</u> total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 214 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 551 for Property Crimes.
- 256 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- <u>135</u> children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (increase from **129** kids in 2019; 4.7% increase).

# Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



- In 2021, <u>52</u> children exited foster care due to age (34.2% decrease from 2020).
- 263 children were living with non-relatives; 67 stayed with a relative.
- 84 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 8 children classified as runaways.
- <u>4%</u> of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.






# Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Delaware spent <u>\$74,452,769</u> on child welfare services in 2020
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$9,489,194 = from the federal government
- \$63,693,345 = from state and local funds


### Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the \$9,489,194 in federal funding received in Delaware in 2020:

- \$2,318,573 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$3,273,173 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Delaware's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$3,359,427

# Child Care & Early Learning



- <u>19%</u> of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 11% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 13% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- <u>\$14,995</u> annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$10,146 annual cost of home-based infant care






## Child Poverty

- <u>54,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2023 (26% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from <u>7,845</u> in 2022 to <u>8,371</u> in 2023 (6.7% increase).



### **HOUSING**


- <u>1,129</u> children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (2.64%)
- <u>37.9%</u> of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- 24% of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>3,904</u> total Delaware residents living in public housing

### Child Poverty Over Time



- The state spent \$5,442,394 on WIC in 2023, serving 19,845 people: an 11.7% increase in total participants and 7.7% increase in spending since 2022.
- 120,130 people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 37,680 children.
- 43.7% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2021 had children.

#### Total Urban vs. Rural Population of Delaware, <u>2020</u>






## Health

- <u>954</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (**9.2**% of births).
- <u>1,171</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2022 (10.83% of births).
  - 10.21% of all White babies
  - 13.60% of all Black babies
- 44 births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 a rate of 13 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>62</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023; a rate of **5.9** per 1,000.

# Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, 2022




### Medicaid Expansion

Delaware is a <u>Medicaid expansion</u> state.

### **Maternal Mortality**

- 2 Delaware women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- For every 100,000 live births in Delaware, there is an unknown number of maternal deaths
- <u>11,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2023 (57% increase from 2022).
- 89,000 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2023 (4.7% increase from 2022).
- <u>12,838</u> children in Delaware were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (5% decrease from 2020).

# Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>








### Zero to Three

- 56.9% of babies live above low-income
- 19.4% of babies live at low income
- 23.7% of babies live in poverty
- 8.6% of babies live in deep poverty
- 74.4% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

#### Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, Delaware reported <u>235</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- Delaware reported 228 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Delaware <u>has a Family First plan</u> submitted to the administration.


### Teens & Youth

- <u>3,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2023 (5%)
- 13 children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Delaware in 2020.

### Mental Health

- 4,044 children received mental health treatment in Delaware in 2022 (0.2%)
- In 2022 there were <u>8.0</u> deaths from suicide per 100,000 adolescents aged 15–19 in Delaware.

# Treatment Type for Youth with Substance Use Disorder, <u>2023</u>



- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>8,800</u> children in Delaware (3.1% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, 7,386 clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD.
