
### Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, Illinois had <u>93,342</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. All referrals were screened in for response by CPS.
- 32,054 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 11.8 children per 1,000 (3.8% decrease since 2019).
- Of the **32,054** children, **19,877** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 3,846 of the 32,054 cases.

#### Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




### Workforce

There are 16,430 children, family, and school social workers in Illinois with a mean wage of \$30.57 (compared to Illinois's minimum wage: \$15.00)





#### Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- 81.5% = parents of the child.
- 18.5% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2023):

- 49.2% = female; 50.5% = male.
- Child fatalities decreased from <u>110</u> in 2022 to 83 in 2023.
- Illinois reported 0 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **16,445** victims and **27,457** non-victims.


### Age Distribution of Maltreatment



### Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>26,658</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 20,743 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **5,718** children entered care and **5,915** exited.
- 1,658 children were adopted; 3,391 were waiting to be adopted.
- 1.6% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021–2022. Adoptions from the system increased by 3.5% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021





### Juvenile Justice


- <u>696</u> total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 95 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 66 for Property Crimes.
- 0 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- <u>516</u> children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from **834** kids in 2019; 38% decline).

# Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



- In 2021, <u>676</u> children exited foster care due to age (13% increase from 2020).
- 7,650 children were living with non-relatives; 9,220 stayed with a relative.
- 557 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 492 children classified as runaways.
- 4% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.






# Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Illinois spent <u>\$1,238,584,971.95</u> on child welfare services in 2020.
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$590,150,297.95 = from the federal government
- \$628,212,890 = from state and local funds.


#### Federal Funding Sources, 2020



The significant funding sectors of the <u>\$590,150,297.95</u> in federal funding received in Illinois in 2020:

- \$23,438,451.00 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$84,213,595.00 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Illinois's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$55,535,390

### Child Care & Early Learning



- <u>22%</u> of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 15% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 15% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- \$16,373 annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$11,691 annual cost of home-based infant care






### Child Poverty

- <u>654,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2023 (24% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients increased from <u>20,307</u> in 2022 to <u>20,567</u> in 2023 (1.26% increase).


# Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, 2023



### HOUSING


- <u>13,603</u> children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (2.53%)
- 24.9% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- <u>28%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>66,360</u> total Illinois residents living in public housing

#### **Child Poverty Over Time**



- The state spent \$127,206,872 on WIC in 2024, serving 170,102 people: a 3.12% increase in total participants and 9.15% increase in spending since 2023.
- <u>1,201,290</u> people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 315,330 children.
- <u>38.3%</u> of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.

## Total Urban vs. Rural Population of Illinois, <u>2020</u>






### Health

- <u>11,071</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (8.9% of births).
- <u>13,564</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2022 (10.57%).
  - 9.47% of all White babies
  - 15.25% of all Black babies
- 4,324 births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 -- a rate of 11 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- 715 infants aged <1yr died in 2022 -- a rate of 6 per 1,000.

# Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2022</u>




#### **Medicaid Expansion**

Illinois has been a Medicaid expansion state since 01/01/2014

#### **Maternal Mortality**

- 123 Illinois women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents.
- For every 100,000 live births in Illinois, there is **18** maternal deaths.
  - <u>93,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2023 (6% decrease from 2022).
  - 1,357,701 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2021 (1.6% increase from 2020).
  - 336,655 children in Illinois were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (1.9% increase from 2020).

# Health Insurance Coverage for Children, 2021








#### Zero to Three

- 63.4% of babies live above low-income
- 19.4% of babies live at low income
- 17.2% of babies live in poverty
- 9.2% of babies live in deep poverty
- 80.4% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

#### Prenatal Substance Exposure

In 2023, Illinois reported <u>592</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.

Illinois <u>has a Family First plan</u> approved by the administration.


#### Teens & Youth

- <u>36,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (5%)
- <u>182</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Illinois in 2022.

#### Mental Health

- 4,939 children received mental health treatment in Illinois in 2022 (0.2%)
- In 2022, there were <u>9.4</u> deaths per 100,000 adolescents aged 15-19 in Illinois.

#### Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>49,402</u> children in Illinois (1.1% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>2,716</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD
