
Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, Louisiana had <u>51,119</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. All referrals were screened in for response by CPS.
- **8,971** child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of **8.4** children per 1,000 (**6.3**% increase since 2019).
- Of the **8,971** children, **7,025** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 2,626 of the 8,971 cases.

Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




Workforce

There are <u>670</u> children, family, and school social workers in Louisiana with a mean wage of \$24.38 (compared to Louisiana's minimum wage: \$7.25)



Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023 Unknown




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

 Louisiana did not report data revealing the perpetrators' relation to their victims.

Child victims (2023):

- 51.6% = female; 48% = male.
- Child fatalities increased from <u>29</u> in 2022 to <u>47</u> in 2023.
- Louisiana reported 0 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **5,131** victims and **2,118** non-victims.


Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, 2023



Foster Care and Adoptions

- 6,317 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **3,682** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 3,064 children entered care and **2.635** exited.
- 686 children were adopted; 973 were waiting to be adopted.
- 11.5% increase in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system increased by 14% from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021





Juvenile Justice

- 12,267 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 1,573 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 2,546 for Property Crimes.
- 921 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 717 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 693 kids in 2019; 3.5% decline).

Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



• In 2021, 145 children exited foster care due

- 1,655 children were living with nonrelatives; 1,063 stayed with a relative.
- 245 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 19 children classified as runaways.



Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Louisiana spent \$259,545,375.00 on child welfare services in 2020.
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$165,741,651.00 = from the federal government.
- \$87,717,453.00 = from state and local funds.



- \$44,145,600.00 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$21,836,535.00 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Louisiana's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$28,802,515

Child Care & Early Learning



- <u>31%</u> of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 8% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 14% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- \$10,101 annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$8,035 annual cost of home-based infant care






Child Poverty

- <u>339,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2023 (32% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients increased from <u>9,095</u> in 2022 to <u>11,369</u> in 2023 (25.4% increase).


Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2023</u>



HOUSING


- <u>6,338</u> children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (2.84%)
- 37.1% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- 31% of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>30,287</u> total Louisiana residents living in public housing

Child Poverty Over Time



- The state spent \$70,811,702 on WIC in 2024, serving 98,777 people: a 7.7% increase in total participants and an 28.7% increase in spending since 2023.
- 755,559 people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 216,215 children.
- 44.9% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2019 had children.

Total Urban vs. Rural Population of Louisiana, <u>2020</u>








Health

- <u>6,176</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) were born in 2023 (11.3% of births).
- <u>7,515</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2022 (13.32%).
 - 11.53% of all White babies
 - 16.78% of all Black babies
- 3,490 births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 -- a rate of 23 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>396</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023 -- a rate of 7 per 1,000.

Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, 2022




Medicaid Expansion

Louisiana became a Medicaid expansion state on 7/1/2016.

Maternal Mortality

- 108 Louisiana women died while pregnant or within 42 days post-pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents.
- For every 100,000 live births in Louisiana, there are 37 maternal deaths.
 - 48,000 children had no health insurance in 2023 (23% increase from 2022).
 - 609,000 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2023 (2.4% increase from 2022).
 - <u>181,891</u> children in Louisiana were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (3% increase from 2020).

Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>








Zero to Three

- 50.8% of babies live above low-income
- 21.6% of babies live at low income
- 27.6% of babies live in poverty
- 15.9% of babies live in deep poverty
- 72.6% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

Prenatal Substance Exposure

In 2023, Louisiana reported <u>2,140</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.

Louisiana <u>has a Family First plan</u> approved by the administration.


Teens & Youth

- <u>23,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2023 (9%)
- 131 children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Louisiana in 2022.

Mental Health

- <u>7,571</u> children received mental health treatment in Louisiana in 2022 (0.4%)
- In 2022, there were 10.7 suicide deaths per 100,000 adolescents aged 15-19 in Louisiana.

Treatment Type for Youth with Substance Use Disorder, <u>2023</u>



- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>39,153</u> children in Louisiana (2.5% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>755</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD.
