
### Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, Michigan had <u>178,315</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 67,331 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 22,728 were child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 10.8 children per 1,000 (31.2% decrease since 2019).
- Of the 22,728 children, **14,435** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 22,728 of the 762 cases.

#### Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




### Workforce

There are <u>14,480</u> child, family, and school social workers in Michigan with a median wage of \$27.29 (compared to Michigan's minimum wage: <u>\$10.33</u>)



### Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- 74% = parents of the child.
- 26% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2023):

- 49% = female; 51% = male.
- Child fatalities decreased from <u>61</u> in 2022 to <u>43</u> in 2023.
- Michigan reported 5 total child victim of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **9,042** victims and **17,815** non-victims.


### Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, 2023



### Foster Care and Adoptions

- 13,182 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **8,940** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 3,625 children entered care and **4,242** exited.
- 1,654 children were adopted; 3,167 were waiting to be adopted.
- **6.2**% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 2% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021




The increase since 2020 15.7% in children transitioning from foster care to independence.

### Juvenile Justice


- 11,172 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 408 for Disorderly Conduct.
- **2,646** for Property Crimes.
- 403 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 723 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 1,353 kids in 2019; 46.6% decline).

#### Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



- In 2021, <u>643</u> children exited foster care due to age (15.7% increase from 2020).
- 3,548 children were living with nonrelatives; 4,333 stayed with a relative.
- 500 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 79 children classified as runaways.
- 4% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

The decline since 2019 of children living in juvenile correction facilities.






# Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Michigan spent <u>\$1,030,507,271.00</u> on child welfare services in 2020
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$743,039,988.50 = from the federal government
- \$282,267,516.00 = from state and local funds.


### Federal Funding Sources, <u>2020</u>



The significant funding sectors of the \$1,030,507,271.00 in federal funding received in Michigan in 2020:

- \$104,115,985.00 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$107,302,726.00 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Michigan's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$125,747,457

### Child Care & Early Learning



- <u>30%</u> of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 12% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 7% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- <u>\$12,667</u> annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$9,044 annual cost of home-based infant care






### Child Poverty


- <u>552,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2023 (26% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from 22,034 in 2022 to 23,110 in 2023 (5% increase).

### Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2023</u>




### **HOUSING**

- 7,595 children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (1.79%)
- 25.6% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- <u>25%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>27,039</u> total Michigan residents living in public housing



- The state spent \$64,193,369 on WIC in 2023, serving 205,875 people: an 3% increase in total participants and 5% increase in spending since 2022.
- <u>1,423,000</u> people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 378,040 children.
- <u>33.8%</u> of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2021 had children.

### Total Urban vs. Rural Population of Michigan, <u>2020</u>








### Health

- <u>8,827</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (**8.9**% of births).
- <u>10,664</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2022 (10.43% of births).
  - 9.39% of all White babies
  - 15.07% of all Black babies
- <u>3,418</u> births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 -- a rate of 11 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>603</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023; a rate of **6.1** per 1,000.

### Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2022</u>




### **Medicaid Expansion**

Michigan became a <u>Medicaid</u> expansion state on 4/1/2014.

### **Maternal Mortality**

- 101 Michigan women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- For every 100,000 live births in Michigan, there is are 19 maternal deaths
- <u>66,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2023 (10% increase from 2022).
- <u>875,000</u> children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2023 (2% decrease from 2022).
- <u>96,739</u> children in Michigan were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (40% increase from 2020).

### Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>






### Zero to Three

- <u>58.6%</u> of babies live above low-income
- 20.6% of babies live at low income
- 20.8% of babies live in poverty
- 11.4% of babies live in deep poverty
- 71.7% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

#### Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, Michigan reported <u>6,048</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- Michigan reported **5,874** plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Michigan does have a Family First plan approved by the administration.


### Teens & Youth

- <u>34,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2023 (7%)
- <u>117</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Michigan in 2020.

### Mental Health

- <u>70,735</u> children received mental health treatment in Michigan in 2022 (3.8%)
- In 2022 there were 10.5 deaths from suicide per 100,000 adolescents aged 15-19 in Michigan.

#### Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>70,473</u> children in Michigan (2.3% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>56,926</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD.
