
Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, there were nationally 4,028,945 total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, 2,107,473 were screened in for response by CPS.
- 546,159 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 7.4 children per 1,000 (19.3% decrease since 2019).
- Of the **546,159** children, **382,603** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 77,570 of the 546,159 cases.

Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




Workforce

There are around 352,160 children, family, and school social workers nationally with a mean wage of \$28.46 (compared to the national minimum wage: \$7.25)





Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- <u>75.95%</u> = parents of the child.
- 24.05% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2023):

- 52.0% = female; 47.6% = male.
- Child fatalities decreased from <u>2,010</u> in 2022 to <u>1,968</u> in 2023.
- Nationally, there were 800 total child victims of sex trafficking reported.
- Post-response services given to 300,288 victims and 586,986 non-victims.


Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, <u>2023</u>



Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>570,000</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **369,000** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 187,000 children entered care and 201.000 exited.
- 53,700 children were adopted; 109,000 were waiting to be adopted.
- 5.9% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 0.9% from 2021.

Duration in Care, 2021




The decrease since 2020 in children transitioning from foster care to independence.

Juvenile Justice


- 447,119 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 34,425 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 80,588 for Property Crimes.
- 51,048 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 24,894 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 36,479 kids in 2019; 31.8% decline).

Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? <u>2021</u>



- In 2021, 19,237 children exited foster care due to age (3.9% decrease from 2020).
- 171,916 children were living with nonrelatives; 134,028 stayed with a relative.
- 35,469 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 4,234 children classified as runaways.
- 4% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

Adoption, <u>2020</u>




The decline since 31.8% 2019 of children living in juvenile correction facilities.





Funding for Child Welfare Services

- The Nation spent \$31,366,263,465.19 on child welfare services in 2020.
 - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$15,182,888,437.62 = from the federal government
- \$15,920,344,036.98 = from state and local funds.

The significant funding sectors of the \$15,182,888,437.62 in federal funding given to the states in 2020:

Title IV-B

- \$4,184,110,643.16 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$3,220,890,120.33 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- The United State's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$2,663,376,822

Child Care & Early Learning

- <u>22,982,579</u> Children 5 and under nationally
- 14,813,607 Children 5 and under with all available parents in the workforce
- 6,280,772 Children 5 and under eligible for CCDBG
- 839,226 Children 5 and under served by CCDBG
- 13% Eligible children served by CCDBG due to insufficient federal funding
- Copayments for a three-person family earning \$30,000 per year range from:
 - \$0 per month in 24 States/Territories --> \$477 per month in Nevada
- Median monthly copayment is \$10
- Families that do not receive subsidies pay significantly higher costs. Price of center-based infant care ranges from:
 - \$607 per month (Mississippi) --> \$2,039 per month (Massachusetts)






Child Poverty

- <u>18,635,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (26% of all children).
- 30% of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from <u>1,847,644</u> in 2021 to <u>1,862,756</u> in 2022 (.82% increase).


Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2023</u>



HOUSING


- <u>364,390</u> children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (2.5%)
- 30.1% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- <u>30%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>9.05 million</u> Americans reported living in public housing in 2023.

Child Poverty Over Time



- The U.S. spent \$4,424,126,987 on WIC in 2023, serving 6,575,977 people: a 5.04% increase in total participants and 23.3% increase in spending since 2022.
- <u>47,000,000</u> people were food insecure in 2022, including **14,000,000** children.
- >50,000,000 people turned to food programs in 2023.

Total Urban vs. Rural Population of the United States, <u>2020</u>






Health

- <u>308,263</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (**8.6**% of births).
- <u>383,979</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (10.5% of births).
 - 9.5% of all White babies
 - 14.8% of all Black babies
- <u>140,977</u> births to mothers aged 15–19 in 2023 a rate of 13 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>20,145</u> infants <1yr died in 2023 -- a rate of **6** in every 1,000 infants.

Medicaid Expansion


Nationally, <u>Medicaid expansion</u> has been adopted by 41 states.

Maternal Mortality

- 4,295 American women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- Nationally, there were <u>23</u> maternal deaths per every 100,000 live births
- <u>3,932,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2022 (5.6% decrease from 2021).
- 30,070,000 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2022 (1.3% decrease from 2021).
- <u>7,628,401</u> children in the U.S. were in the Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (6.33% decrease from 2020).

Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>






Zero to Three

- 61.1% of babies live above low-income
- 20.3% of babies live at low income
- 18.6% of babies live in poverty
- 9.6% of babies live in deep poverty
- 75.8% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, nationally, there were <u>44,453</u> infants reported screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- Nationally, 23,319 plans of safe care were reported for screened-in infants.


Teens & Youth

- <u>1,168,000</u> youth (16–19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2023 (7%)
- 4,368 children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in the U.S. in 2020.

Mental Health

- <u>1,853,636</u> children received mental health treatment nationally in 2022
- In 2022, there was <u>10.5</u> suicide deaths per 100,000 adolescents aged 15-19 nationally.

Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>2.9</u>
 <u>million</u> children in the United States
 (31.6% of children) lived with parents
 having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>85,718</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD
