

## **Child Maltreatment**


- In 2023, Oregon had <u>83,116</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, **35,847** were screened in for response by CPS.
- 10,773 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 13.0 children per 1,000 (20.5% decrease since 2019).
- Of the **10,773** children, **6,887** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 1,031 of the 10,773 cases.



- <u>68.1%</u> = parents of the child.
- 31.8% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2023):

- 53.4% = female; 46.3% = male.
- Child fatalities were stagnant from <u>19</u> in 2022 to <u>19</u> in 2023.
- Oregon reported 0 total child victim of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 11,630 victims and 44,092 non-victims.


#### Age Distribution of Maltreatment <sub>30</sub> Victims, <u>2023</u>




## Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>7,410</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 4,826 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **2,297** children entered care and **2,584** exited.
- 585 children were adopted; 912 were waiting to be adopted.
- 8.4% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 15.9% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021




#### Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? <u>2021</u>




- In 2021, <u>268</u> children exited foster care due to age (2.9% decrease from 2020).
- 2,023 children were living with non-relatives; 1,823 stayed with a relative.
- 313 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 69 children classified as runaways.
- <u>3%</u> of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

#### Adoption, <u>2020</u>








## Funding for Child Welfare Services


- Oregon spent <u>\$666,139,625</u> on child welfare services in 2020.
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- **\$247,251,001** = from the federal government
- **\$414,569,324** = from state and local funds.



## The significant funding sectors of the \$247,251,001 in federal funding received in Oregon in 2020:

- \$102,700,183 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$45,421,299 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Oregon's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2021 was \$20,772,722



## **Child Poverty**

- <u>223,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (27% of all children).
- <u>30%</u> of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- Average number of TANF recipients rose from <u>31,924</u> in 2021 to <u>37,397</u> in 2022 (17.1% increase).


Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2023</u>



## HOUSING


- <u>5,392</u> children, from birth to three-yearsold, are experiencing homelessness (3.31%)
- <u>29.8%</u> of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- <u>30% of children lived in households with</u> a high housing cost burden.
- <u>4,833</u> total Oregon residents living in public housing





- The state spent <u>\$44,297,701</u> on WIC in 2023, serving 77,102 people: a 3.93% increase in total participants and 18.5% increase in spending since 2022.
- <u>554,550</u> people were food insecure in 2021, including 144,210 children.
- 28.2% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2021 had children.

#### Total Urban vs. Rural Population of Oregon, <u>2020</u>






## Health

- <u>2,740</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (7.2% of births).
- <u>3,633</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (8.9% of births).</li>
  - 8.49% of all White babies
  - 12.96% of all Black babies
- <u>1,172</u> births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 -- a rate of 9 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>176</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023; a rate of 5 per 1,000.

## Medicaid Expansion


Oregon has been a <u>Medicaid</u> <u>expansion</u> state since 01/01/2014.



#### Maternal Mortality

- <u>34</u> Oregon women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- For every 100,000 live births in Oregon, there is 17 maternal deaths
- <u>27,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2022 (**12.9**% decrease from 2021).
- <u>407,989</u> children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2021 (8% increase from 2020).
- <u>216,941</u> children in Oregon were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (15.8% increase from 2020).

#### Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>






## Zero to Three

- 67.1% of babies live above low-income
- 19.0% of babies live at low income
- 13.9% of babies live in poverty
- 6.1% of babies live in deep poverty
- 79.0% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

## Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, Oregon reported 13 infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- Oregon reported 11 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Oregon has a Family First plan approved by the administration.


## Teens & Youth

- <u>15,000</u> youth (16–19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2023 (6%)
- <u>39</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Oregon in 2020.

## Mental Health

- <u>47,109</u> children received mental health treatment in Oregon in 2022 (2.5%)
- In 2022, there were <u>13.7</u> suicide deaths per 100,000 adolescents aged 15-19 in Oregon.

## Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>25,031</u> children in Oregon (1.9% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, 1,180 clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD
