
### Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, Texas had <u>245,430</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, <u>207,429</u> were screened in for response by CPS.
- 54,476 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 7.2 children per 1,000 (15% decrease since 2019).
- Of the **54,476** children, **43,827** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 10,203 of the 54,476 cases.

#### Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




### Workforce

There are 21,210 children, family, and school social workers in Texas with a mean wage of \$24.34 (compared to Texas' minimum wage: \$7.25)





#### Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- 96.1% = parents of the child.
- 3.9% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

Child victims (2023):

- 60.8% = female; 39.2% = male.
- Child fatalities increased from <u>176</u> in 2022 to **187** in 2023.
- Texas reported 13 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to 23,786 victims and 12,581 non-victims.

### Foster Care and Adoptions

- <u>37,425</u> total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- 21,358 in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, **9,486** children entered care and **16,067** exited.
- 4,361 children were adopted; 10,232 were waiting to be adopted.
- 23.8% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021–2022. Adoptions from the system also decreased by 6.2% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021





### Juvenile Justice


- <u>49,409</u> total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 960 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 9,351 for Property Crimes.
- 8,464 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 2,730 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 3,699 kids in 2019; 26% decline).

## Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? 2021



- In 2021, <u>1,187</u> children exited foster care due to age (3.5% decrease from 2020).
- 12,417 children were living with non-relatives; 9,457 stayed with a relative.
- 2,968 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 220 children classified as runaways.
- 4% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.






# Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Texas spent **\$1,886,495,915.24** on child welfare services in 2020.
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$918,638,695.49 = from the federal government
- \$948,428,755.00 = from state and local funds.


#### Federal Funding Sources, 2021



The significant funding sectors of the \$918,638,695.49 in federal funding received in Texas in 2020:

- \$185,669,653.00 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$167,629,378.00 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Texas' sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$185,296,210

### Child Care & Early Learning



- 22% of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 7% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 13% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- <u>\$11,024</u> annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$9,724 annual cost of home-based infant care






### **Child Poverty**

- <u>1,849,000</u> children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2023 (25% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients decreased from <u>37,211</u> in 2021 to <u>22,152</u> in 2022 (40.5% decrease).


#### Child Poverty by Race or Ethnicity, 2023



### **HOUSING**


- <u>30,280</u> children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (2.01%)
- 41.3% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- 33% of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- <u>79,193</u> total Texas residents living in public housing

#### Child Poverty Over Time



- The state spent \$421,181,857 on WIC in 2023, serving 762,817 people: a 9.1% increase in total participants and a 35.8% increase in spending since 2022.
- <u>818,513</u> people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 228,799 children.
- 41.8% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2021 had children.

## Total Urban vs. Rural Population of Texas, 2020






### Health

- <u>33,329</u> low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (8.6% of births).
- <u>42,518</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (11.4%).
  - 10.1% of all White babies
  - 15.1% of all Black babies
- <u>20,856</u> births to mothers aged 15-19 in 2023 -- a rate of 19 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>2,259</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023 -- a rate of 6 per 1,000.


Texas is not a <u>Medicaid expansion</u> state.

### **Maternal Mortality**

- <u>532</u> Texas women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- For every 100,000 live births in Texas, there are 28 maternal deaths
  - <u>943,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2023 (10.4% increase from 2022).
  - 3,496,128 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2021 (4.4% increase from 2020).
  - <u>799,975</u> children in Texas were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (13.2% decrease from 2020).

## Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>






### Zero to Three

- 56.5% of babies live above low-income
- 22.3% of babies live at low income
- 21.2% of babies live in poverty
- 10.4% of babies live in deep poverty
- 74% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

#### Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, Texas reported <u>1,053</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- Texas reported 1,053 plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Texas <u>does not have a Family First</u> <u>plan</u> approved by the administration.


### Teens & Youth

- <u>135,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (8%)
- <u>543</u> children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Texas in 2022.

### Mental Health

- 100,710 children received mental health treatment in Texas in 2022 (5.4%)
- In 2022, there were <u>12.1</u> deaths by suicide per 100,000 adolescents aged 15-19 in Texas.

#### Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of
   126,319 children in Texas (1.2% of the
   state's child population) lived with parents
   having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>1,633</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD
