
### Child Maltreatment

- In 2023, Utah had <u>47,226</u> total referrals for child abuse and neglect. Of those, **21,506** were screened in for response by CPS.
- 8,640 child victims of abuse or neglect, at a rate of 9.3 children per 1,000 (18.3% decrease since 2019).
- Of the **8,640** children, **5,952** were first-time victims.
- Largest age group of victims = <1years, representing 657 of the 8,640 cases.

#### Types of Maltreatment Victims, 2023




### Workforce

There are <u>1,780</u> children, family, and school social workers in Utah with a mean wage of \$25.83 (compared to Utah's minimum wage: \$7.25)





### Child Victims by Race or Ethnicity, 2023




#### Perpetrators of child maltreatment (2023):

- 86.6% = parents of the child.
- 13.4% = non-parents or unknown relationship.

#### Child victims (2023):

- 53.2% = female; 46.8% = male.
- Child fatalities increased from <u>15</u> in 2022 to 17 in 2023.
- Utah reported 3 total child victims of sex trafficking.
- Post-response services given to **7,388** victims and **12,860** non-victims.


# Age Distribution of Maltreatment Victims, <u>2023</u>



### Foster Care and Adoptions

- 3,568 total children were served by the foster care system in FY 2022.
- **2,067** in care as of 09/30/2022.
- During 2022, 1,459 children entered care and **1,501** exited.
- 556 children were adopted; 585 were waiting to be adopted.
- 2.5% decrease in the number of children in care between 2021-2022. Adoptions from the system decreased by 0.7% from 2021.

#### Duration in Care, 2021




The increase since 2020 17.3% in children transitioning from foster care to independence.

### Juvenile Justice

- 11,334 total arrests for children under 18 in 2019.
- 330 for Disorderly Conduct.
- 2,330 for Property Crimes.
- 1,968 for Drug Abuse Violations.
- 168 children lived in juvenile correction facilities in 2021 (decrease from 246 kids in 2019; 31.7% decline).

#### Where are Children in Foster Care Staying? <u>2021</u>




• In 2021, <u>115</u> children exited foster care due to age (17.3% decrease from 2020).

- 967 children were living with nonrelatives; 666 stayed with a relative.
- 127 children were staying in group homes or institutions; 29 children classified as runaways.
- 2% of households had a grandparent living with a grandchild.

The decline since 31.7% 2019 of children living in juvenile correction facilities.






# Funding for Child Welfare Services

- Utah spent \$226,606,028 on child welfare services in 2020.
  - Child welfare services = direct and administrative services
- \$92,133,784 = from the federal government
- \$129,122,643 = from state and local funds.


#### Federal Funding Sources, 2021



The significant funding sectors of the \$92,133,784 in federal funding received in Utah in 2020:

- \$19,860,260 as part of the Title IV-E Total Foster Care Program.
- \$12,662,234 as part of the Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Program.
- Utah's sum of expenditures for Social Service Block Grants in 2022 was \$22,474,573

### Child Care & Early Learning



- <u>31%</u> of Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 13% of Early Head Start eligible children are enrolled
- 13% of Child Care & Development Block Grant eligible children 5 and under are served
- <u>\$11,232</u> annual cost of center-based infant care
- \$8,400 annual cost of home-based infant care






### Child Poverty


- 161,000 children lived with parents who lacked secure employment in 2022 (17% of all children).
- Average number of TANF recipients decreased from <u>5,361</u> in 2021 to <u>4,357</u> in 2022 (18.7% decrease).

### **HOUSING**


- 3,185 children, from birth to threeyears-old, are experiencing homelessness (2.01%)
- 38.2% of households receiving the Low Income Housing Tax Credit report having at least one member under 18
- 25% of children lived in households with a high housing cost burden.
- 1,976 total Utah residents living in public housing



- The state spent \$28,787,245 on WIC in 2023, serving **10,928** people: a **2.5**% decrease in total participants and a 34.5% increase in spending since 2022.
- 430,483 people were food insecure between 2021 and 2023, including 157,555 children.
- 51.3% of households receiving SNAP benefits in 2021 had children.






### Health

- 3,308 low birth-weight babies (<5.5lbs) born in 2023 (7.4% of births).
- <u>4,621</u> preterm births (<37wks) in 2021 (9.9%).
  - 9.6% of all White babies
  - 11.8% of all Black babies
- <u>1,202</u> births to mothers aged 15–19 in 2023 a rate of 9 in every 1,000 teen girls.
- <u>235</u> infants aged <1yr died in 2023 -- a rate of 5 per 1,000.

# Percentage of All Preterm Births by Race or Ethnicity, <u>2021</u>




#### **Medicaid Expansion**

Utah is a <u>Medicaid expansion</u> state, implemented on 1/1/2020.

### **Maternal Mortality**

- <u>36</u> Utah women died while pregnant, or within 42 days post pregnancy from any cause relating to or aggravated by said pregnancy, excluding accidents and incidents
- For every 100,000 live births in Utah, there are **16** maternal deaths
  - <u>66,000</u> children had no health insurance in 2023 (8.2% increase from 2022).
  - 230,884 children were enrolled in Medicaid in 2021 (7.6% increase from 2020).
  - <u>42,338</u> children in Utah were in the state Children Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in 2021 (14.6% decrease from 2020).

# Health Insurance Coverage for Children, <u>2021</u>








### Zero to Three

- <u>68.2%</u> of babies live above low-income
- 21.4% of babies live at low income
- 10.5% of babies live in poverty
- 3.4%% of babies live in deep poverty
- 82.3% of new parents have at least one parent working full time

#### Plans for Safe Care

- In 2023, Utah reported <u>131</u> infants screened in with prenatal substance exposure.
- Utah reported **35** plans of safe care for screened-in infants.

Utah <u>has a Family First plan</u> approved by the administration.


### Teens & Youth

- <u>16,000</u> youth (16-19yrs) were not in school nor working in 2022 (7%)
- 29 children <19yrs were killed by a firearm in Utah in 2022.

### Mental Health

- 21,160 children received mental health treatment in Utah in 2022 (1.1%)
- In 2022, there were <u>17.2</u> deaths by suicide per 100,000 adolescents aged 15–19 in Utah.

#### Substance Use

- From 2015 to 2019, an average of <u>25,390</u> children in Utah (1.6% of the state's child population) lived with parents having a substance use disorder.
- On March 31st, 2023, <u>886</u> clients 18 and under were in treatment for SUD.
