Senate Majority Leader Thune, Senate Minority Leader Schumer, Chairman Boozman, and Ranking Member Klobuchar –

As organizations that work with young adults experiencing homelessness and/or young people who have spent time in foster care, the 171 undersigned organizations are deeply concerned with the provision in the Senate Agriculture reconciliation text that eliminates the bipartisan agreement to exclude young people exiting foster care, homeless individuals, and veterans from the work requirement for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Each of these populations has unique considerations, and each exemption should be maintained.

On June 3, 2023, the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 (FRA) was signed into law, adding new exceptions to the Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) time limit which are intended to help individuals experiencing homelessness, young adults who are leaving foster care and veterans receive and maintain SNAP benefits. ABAWDs cannot receive SNAP benefits for more than 3 months within a 3-year period unless they meet the ABAWD work requirement or are exempt; the FRA adds a new exception to the ABAWD time-limit for homeless individuals and young adults, age 18 to 24 years who are in foster care at the time they turn 18 (or higher age if the State offers extended foster care to a higher age), and veterans.

As you know, SNAP can be a vital lifeline and support for young people as they transition to adulthood, especially for young people leaving foster care or experiencing homelessness. Accessing and maintaining eligibility for SNAP helps provide a level of stability that allows these young adults to thrive. Eliminating this exemption will create additional hardship for young people who already have limited supports and resources and who frequently have no close family members or supportive adults that can assist them.

For young people leaving foster care or experiencing homelessness, work requirements create obstacles that can be particularly difficult to overcome due to their lack of family and social support. These requirements can hinder their ability to navigate life as independent adults and find stability through housing and employment.

Furthermore, veterans often live with health conditions that make it difficult or impossible to find or maintain meaningful work. This barrier to employment is even worse for those living in rural areas with limited job opportunities. Veterans must not be punished with hunger because they struggle to meet SNAP's onerous work reporting requirements.

The undersigned organizations urge you, the leaders of the Senate and the Senate Committee on Agriculture, to oppose the elimination of the bipartisan agreement to exempt young people leaving foster care or who are experiencing homelessness and veterans from the SNAP work requirements. Our work is guided by the principle that an individual's wellbeing should be the paramount consideration when making policy decisions; eliminating this provision will cause harm to some of the most vulnerable young people and adults in our nation, populations that have shared histories of trauma, deep poverty, and lack of support.
